To apply, submit (everything together):

- Completed <u>application</u>
  - Upon completion of application, apply for <u>fingerprinting</u> using TEACH account.
- Official college transcript(s)
- Copy of currently valid certification from the state you are certified in (Connecticut)
- Verification of completion of required <u>tests</u> and <u>workshops</u>: Child Abuse Identification and Reporting, Dignity for All Students Act (DASA), School Violence Prevention and Intervention.

## FAQs (for those not completing teacher preparation programs in New York)

**How do these test requirements affect applicants from other states? Candidates** must generally complete tests in New York State. However, some test administrations are offered in other states, Puerto Rico, and Canada. Go to <u>nystce.nesinc.com</u> for complete information about test offerings and administrations at these locations.

Which tests do I have to take and how much do they cost? Usually, you must pass Educating All Students Test (EAS) and the appropriate Content Specialty Test (CST). Use the website listed below to verify requirements.

- View <u>certification requirements</u> for each endorsement area
  - For example, for elementary choose: Classroom Teacher > Childhood Education > Childhood – Grades 1-6 > Childhood Education (Grades 1-6) > Initial Certificate
  - Click on Pathway: Completion of a Comparable Educator Program in Another U.S. State
- Updated test fee information is <u>online</u>.
- edTPA is no longer required in NY <u>as of April 2022</u>.
